RE: SFL Improvement Project No. 2021-01 (Sunnyside Lane Improvement Project); February 2, 2021 City Council Meeting; Agenda Item 7(b)(1-4)

Section 1. Background. At the December 3, 2020 Council meeting, the Council received and preliminarily approved a feasibility report prepared by City Engineer Jeff Sandberg for Improvement Project No. 2021-01 for a two inch mill and overlay.

At the Council meeting on January 5, 2021, the City Engineer reported that based upon recent core samples taken from the asphalt on Sunnyside Lane, the results indicated that the asphalt below the surface had deteriorated to the point that the City Engineer's recommendation is to perform a complete reconstruction by Full-Depth Reclamation to correct any poor subgrade encountered. The change in the scope of the Project will increase the projects costs and the proposed assessment amounts.

The total project costs for the mill and overlay were \$84,710. The total project costs for the Full-Depth Reclamation based on the recommended scope of work is \$146,700. Funding for the project will consist of special assessments to benefitting properties and City financing. The per unit assessment amount for the mill and overlay was \$7,530. The per unit assessment amount for the Full-Depth Reclamation is \$12,980.

As part of the feasibility phase of the project, a Benefit Analysis Report was ordered by the City Council for Sunnyside Lane. Metzen Realty and Associates Co. provided a report, which has been included in the feasibility report dated January 29, 2021. In the report the value-added benefit for a street improvement was found to be up to \$16,000 per parcel for single family homes.

The proposed project schedule includes construction beginning May 2021 with final completion by the fall of 2021.

At the February 2, 2021 Council meeting, the Council will review and discuss the revised Feasibility Report dated January 29, 2021.

At the February 2, 2021 Council meeting, the Council will consider the following four resolutions:

The four separate resolutions are attached to this memo.

Section 2. Resolution Receiving Feasibility Report. The revised feasibility report dated January 29, 2021 will be provided to you by Jeff Sandberg as part of his agenda materials for the February 2, 2021 Council meeting. The attached resolution receives the feasibility report and calls for a public hearing on March 2, 2021 to consider ordering Project No. 2021-01.

Section 3. Resolution Appointing Engineer, Fiscal Advisor and Bond Counsel. The City needs the assistance of consultants in three areas: engineering, fiscal advisor and bond counsel. Enclosed is a resolution that appoints Jeff Sandberg and WSB & Associates as the engineer for the Project. The Resolution also appoints Jessica Cook and Ehlers and Associates as fiscal advisor and Jenny Boulton and Kennedy & Graven as bond counsel.

Section 4. Resolution Approving Preliminary Financing Plan. The Council needs to review and consider the attached financing plan. The proposed funding for the improvements is a combination of City financing and special assessments to benefitting properties. The City Assessment Policy identifies Sunnyside Lane as a Local Street to be assessed 80% of the street improvement costs.

The proposed assessment amount and City financing amount are:

Sunnyside Lane: \$116,820 (80% assessed to 9 parcels)
City Financing: \$29,880 (20% City financing)
TOTAL: \$146,700

The buildable tax parcels abutting or served by the improvements on Sunnyside Lane are proposed to be assessed \$12,980 per buildable tax parcel. The Project is estimated to cost \$146,700 with 80% of the estimated cost assessed to 9 landowners on or served by Sunnyside Lane in the amount of \$12,980 per parcel totaling \$116,820 in assessments for the Project.

Section 5. Resolution Approving Project Schedule. The project schedule calls for a public hearing on Tuesday, March 2, 2021, to consider whether to order Project No. 2021-01; an award of the bid on June 1, 2021; construction in the summer of 2021; and a special assessment hearing on September 7, 2021 to levy the special assessments. A detailed project schedule is attached to the resolution approving the project schedule.

Section 6. Summary. At the February 2, 2021 Council meeting the Council will consider the attached four Resolutions related to Project No. 2021-01.

Said improvements are to be considered pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 429.

City Project No. 2021-01 is proposed to be specially assessed against buildable tax parcels either abutting or served by the improvements. The areas and parcels, as specifically described herein, are subject to the special assessments.

The methodology used to calculate the assessments is that Sunnyside Lane is a local street and 80% of the estimated cost for that segment is proposed to be assessed. The buildable tax parcels abutting or served by the improvements on Sunnyside Lane are proposed to be assessed \$12,980 per buildable tax parcel.

Information concerning project costs and the estimate of the assessments will be available at the hearing. A reasonable estimate of the impact of the assessments will be available at the hearing.

The total estimated cost of the above listed improvements for City Project No. 2021-01 is \$146,700. The total amount proposed to be assessed to landowners is \$116,820. The total amount the City is financing through reserves and bond tax levy is \$29,880.

Persons desiring to be heard with reference to the proposed improvements will be heard at said time of the public hearing. Written or oral objections will be considered at the public hearing.

WHEREAS, the City Council of Sunfish Lake directed WSB & Associates, Inc., the City's consulting engineer, to prepare a feasibility study for the consideration of mill and overlay rehabilitative measures on Sunnyside Lane pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 429.

Section 1. Background. At the December 3, 2020 Council meeting, the Council received and preliminarily approved the feasibility report prepared by City Engineer Jeff Sandberg for Improvement Project No. 2021-02 – Zehnder Road Mill & Overlay (Project No. 2021-02).

At the Council meeting on January 5, 2021, the City Engineer reported that based upon recent core samples taken from the asphalt on Zehnder Road, the results indicated that the asphalt below the surface had deteriorated to the point that the City Engineer's recommendation is to perform a complete reconstruction by Full-Depth Reclamation to correct any poor subgrade encountered. The change in the scope of the Project will increase the projects costs and the proposed assessment amounts.

The total project costs for the mill and overlay were \$37,380. The total project costs for the Full-Depth Reclamation based on the recommended scope of work is \$60,900. Funding for the project will consist of special assessments to benefitting properties and City financing. The per unit assessment amount for the mill and overlay was \$5,980. The per unit assessment amount for the Full-Depth Reclamation is \$9,740.

As part of the feasibility phase of the project, a Benefit Analysis Report was ordered by the City Council for Zehnder Road. Metzen Realty and Associates Co. provided a report, which has been included in the feasibility report dated January 29, 2021. In the report the value-added benefit for a street improvement was found to be up to \$9,700 per parcel for single family homes.

At the February 2, 2021 Council meeting, the Council will review and discuss the revised Feasibility Report dated January 29, 2021.

At the Council meeting on February 2, 2021, the Council will consider the following four resolutions:

1. Resolution Receiving The Feasibility Report Of The Consulting Engineer And Calling For A Public Improvement Hearing Concerning Project No. 2021-02;
2. Resolution Appointing Jeff Sandberg And WSB & Associates, Inc., Jessica Cook And Ehlers And Associates, Inc. And Jenny Boulton And Kennedy & Graven To Assist The City With Project No. 2021-02;
3. Resolution Approving a Preliminary Financing Plan For Project No. 2021-02;
4. Resolution Approving the Project Schedule For Project No. 2021-02.

The four separate resolutions are attached to this memo.

Section 2. Resolution Receiving Feasibility Report. The final feasibility report dated January 29, 2021 was provided to you by Jeff Sandberg as part of his agenda materials for the February 2, 2021 Council meeting. The attached resolution receives the feasibility report and calls for a public hearing on March 2, 2021 to consider ordering Project No. 2021-02.

Section 3. Resolution Appointing Engineer, Fiscal Advisor and Bond Attorney. The City needs the assistance of consultants in three areas: engineering, fiscal advisor and bond counsel. Enclosed is a resolution that appoints Jeff Sandberg and WSB & Associates as the engineer for the Project. The Resolution also appoints Jessica Cook and Ehlers and Associates as fiscal advisor and Jenny Boulton and Kennedy & Graven as bond counsel.

Section 4. Resolution Approving Preliminary Financing Plan. The proposed funding for the improvements is a combination of City financing and special assessments to benefitting properties. The City Assessment Policy identifies Zehnder Road as a Local Street to be assessed 80% of the street improvement costs.
