Extra Patrol / Premise Checks

- Six premise checks were completed.

Traffic Stops

- Fifteen traffic stops were conducted for expired registration, inoperable lights, and lane violations.
- Two citations were issued for speeding.

Suspicious Activity

- A caller reported a drone flying over their property. Officers responded but did not observe a drone or anything unusual.
- A caller reported a vehicle driving slowly through the neighborhood twice; the vehicle was gone prior to officer arrival.
- A delayed report indicated a vehicle without a rear license plate was taking photos of homes. Officers patrolled the area but were unable to locate the vehicle.

Parking

- A resident was advised to have guests park on only one side of the road during a party to ensure emergency vehicle access.
- Permission was granted for approximately 35 vehicles to park in the area for an event.

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Threats / Stalking

- A dispute occurred between two movers assisting a resident. One party threatened to slash the tires on the other's semi-truck. The reporting party dismissed the second mover and was advised to call if the individual returned.

Medical Calls

- A caller's son experienced an allergic reaction. Officers assisted medics.
- Officers assisted medics in lifting a male who had fallen and was unable to move; officers were released by medics.
- A resident reported high blood pressure and a rapid heartbeat. Officers assisted medics.
- Female reported stomach pains. Officers assisted medics.

Civil Paper Service

- Civil process paperwork was served on a resident by the Sheriff's Office.
- A summons was successfully served by the Sheriff's Office.

Motorist Assist

- State Patrol requested assistance with a pontoon blocking an exit ramp. The pontoon had been moved prior to officer's arrival, and no further assistance was needed.

Road and Driving Complaint

- A caller reported a bent stop sign. An officer identified the truck driver who struck the sign un-intentionally. Driver and insurance information obtained. Awaiting invoice for sign replacement to forward to the garbage company to reimburse the City.

Welfare Check

- Officers responded to a report of a male slumped over in a vehicle. Before arrival, the caller woke the individual, who then left the area.

Juvenile Complaint

- A caller reported four children walking through their property to access the lake. It was determined they were the neighbor's children, and no assistance was required.

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Burglary Alarm

- An alarm was activated on an outbuilding. The homeowner was present and reported starting a mower without disabling the alarm.

Theft

- A caller reported a bicycle stolen after it had been left briefly near Robert St and Salem Church Rd.

Animal Call

- A caller witnessed a black vehicle swerve and strike ducklings. The caller had no vehicle information except for a black vehicle. The area was checked for the vehicle but was not located.
